1. The Eskom Holdings SOC Limited has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the Eskom Just Energy Transition Project (EJETP) and intends to apply part of the proceeds toward payments under the contract for Design, supply, installation, commissioning, operation and maintenance of Solar PV plant with capacity of up to 72 MWp for Komati Power Station.
2. The Eskom Holdings SOC Limited intends to initially select Applicants for Design, supply, installation, commissioning, operation and maintenance of Solar PV plant with capacity of up to 72 MWp for Komati Power Station for a period of Three (03) years. It is expected that the Request for Proposals will be made in *November 2025*.
3. Initial Selection will be conducted through the procedures as specified in the World Bank's Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers Fifth Edition September 2023 ("Procurement Regulations"), and is open to all eligible Applicants as defined in the Procurement Regulations.
4. Interested eligible Applicants may obtain further information from the Eskom tender bulletin (<https://tenderbulletin.eskom.co.za>), National Treasury e-tender portal, CIDB Website, UNDB online and World Bank website. A complete set of **Initial Selection** documents in *English* may be downloaded by interested Applicants from above website.
5. Applications for Initial Selection should be submitted in clearly marked envelopes and delivered to the address below by **10:00AM South African Standard Time (SAST) i.e. GMT+2 hours on 30 September 2025**. Late applications will be rejected.

Section I - Instructions to Applicants

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Section I - Instructions to Applicants (ITA)

A. General

- 1. Scope of Application**
 - 1.1 In connection with the invitation for Initial Selection indicated in Section II, Initial Selection Data Sheet (**ISDS**), the Employer, as defined **in the ISDS**, issues this Initial Selection Document (“Initial Selection Document”) to prospective applicants (“Applicants”) interested in submitting applications (“Applications”) for Initial Selection to submit Proposals for the execution of the Works on EPC/Turnkey basis described in Section VII, Scope of Employer’s Requirements. In case proposals for the Works EPC/Turnkey are to be invited as individual contracts (i.e., the slice and package procedure), these are listed **in the ISDS**. The Request for Proposals (RFP) number corresponding to this Initial Selection is also provided **in the ISDS**.
- 2. Source of Funds**
 - 2.1 The Borrower or Recipient (hereinafter called “Borrower”) indicated **in the ISDS** has applied for or received financing (hereinafter called “funds”) from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development or the International Development Association (hereinafter called “the Bank”) in an amount specified **in the ISDS**, towards the cost of the project named **in the ISDS**. The Borrower intends to apply a portion of the funds to eligible payments under the contract(s) resulting from the Request for Proposals (RFP) process for which this Initial Selection is conducted.
 - 2.2 Payment by the Bank will be made only at the request of the Borrower and upon approval by the Bank, and will be subject, in all respects, to the terms and conditions of the Loan (or other financing) Agreement. The Loan (or other financing) Agreement prohibits a withdrawal from the loan (or credit) account for the purpose of any payment to persons or entities, or for any import of goods, equipment, plant or materials, or services if such payment or import, to the knowledge of the Bank, is prohibited by a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. No party other than the Borrower shall derive any rights from the Loan (or other financing) Agreement or have any claim to the proceeds of the loan (or credit).
- 3. Fraud and Corruption**
 - 3.1 The Bank requires compliance with the Bank’s Anti-Corruption Guidelines and its prevailing sanctions policies and

procedures as set forth in the WBG's Sanctions Framework, as set forth in Section VI, Fraud and Corruption.

- 3.2 In further pursuance of this policy, Applicants shall permit and shall cause their agents (where declared or not), subcontractors, subconsultants, service providers, suppliers, and personnel, to permit the Bank to inspect all accounts, records and other documents relating to any Prequalification process, Initial Selection process, Bid submission (in case prequalified), Proposal submission (in case initially selected) and contract performance (in the case of award), and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

4. Eligible Applicants

- 4.1 Applicants shall meet the eligibility criteria as per this ITA and ITA 5.1.
- 4.2 An Applicant may be a firm that is a private entity, a state-owned enterprise or institution subject to ITA 4.9 - or any combination of such entities in the form of a joint venture ("JV") under an existing agreement or with the intent to enter into such an agreement supported by a letter of intent. In the case of a joint venture, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the entire Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate an authorized Representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the Initial Selection process, RFP process (in the event the JV submits a Proposal) and during contract execution (in the event the JV is awarded the Contract). Unless specified **in the ISDS**, there is no limit on the number of members in a JV.
- 4.3 A firm is not permitted to participate for initial selection for the same contract both as an individual firm and as a part of a joint venture or as a subcontractor. However, a firm may participate as a subcontractor in more than one Application but only in the capacity of a subcontractor. Applications submitted in violation of this procedure will be rejected.
- 4.4 A firm and any of its affiliates (that directly or indirectly control, are controlled by or are under common control with that firm) are not permitted to submit more than one application for initial selection for the same contract, either individually, as joint venture or as a subcontractor among them. Applications submitted in violation of this procedure will be rejected.
- 4.5 An Applicant may have the nationality of any country, subject to the restrictions pursuant to ITA 5.1. An Applicant shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if the Applicant is constituted,

incorporated or registered in and operates in conformity with the provisions of the laws of that country, as evidenced by its articles of incorporation (or equivalent documents of constitution or association) and its registration documents, as the case may be. This criterion also shall apply to the determination of the nationality of proposed specialized sub-contractors or suppliers for any part of the Contract including related Services.

- 4.6 Applicants and proposed specialized sub-contractors or suppliers for any part of the Contract including related services (for the purpose of this ITA 4.6 referred to as “Applicants”) shall not have a conflict of interest. Applicants shall be considered to have a conflict of interest, if they, or any of their affiliates, participated as a consultant in the preparation of the Employer’s Requirements or have been hired or proposed to be hired by the Employer or Borrower as Employer’s Representative for contract implementation of the Works EPC/Turnkey that are the subject of this Initial Selection. In addition, Applicants may be considered to have a conflict of interest if they have a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Borrower (or of the project implementing agency, or of a recipient of a part of the loan) who: (i) are directly or indirectly involved in the preparation of the Initial Selection Document or Request for Proposals (RFP) Document or Employer’s Requirements of the Contract, and/or the Proposal evaluation process of such Contract; or (ii) would be involved in the implementation or supervision of such Contract, unless the conflict stemming from such relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the Bank throughout the procurement process and execution of the Contract.
- 4.7 An Applicant that has been sanctioned by the Bank, pursuant to the Bank’s Anti-Corruption Guidelines, and in accordance with its prevailing sanctions policies and procedures as set forth in the WBG’s Sanctions Framework, as described in Section VI, paragraph 2.2 d. shall be ineligible to be prequalified for, initially selected for, bid for, propose for or be awarded a Bank-financed contract or benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or otherwise, during such period of time as the Bank shall have determined.
- 4.8 The list of debarred firms and individuals is available as specified **in the ISDS**.
- 4.9 Applicants that are state-owned enterprise or institutions in the Employer’s Country may be eligible to be initially selected, compete and be awarded a Contract(s) only if they can

establish, in a manner acceptable to the Bank, that they (i) are legally and financially autonomous (ii) operate under commercial law, and (iii) are not under supervision of the Employer.

4.10 An Applicant shall not be under suspension from bidding or submitting proposals by the Employer as the result of the execution of a Bid or Proposal–Securing Declaration.

4.11 An Applicant shall provide such documentary evidence of eligibility satisfactory to the Employer, as the Employer shall reasonably request.

4.12 A firm that is under a sanction of debarment by the Borrower from being awarded a contract is eligible to participate in this procurement, unless the Bank, at the Borrower's request, is satisfied that the debarment:

- (a) relates to fraud or corruption; and
- (b) followed a judicial or administrative proceeding that afforded the firm adequate due process.

5. Eligibility

5.1 Firms and individuals may be ineligible if they are nationals of ineligible countries as indicated in Section V. The countries, persons or entities are ineligible if (a) as a matter of law or official regulations, the Borrower's country prohibits commercial relations with that country, provided that the Bank is satisfied that such exclusion does not preclude effective competition for the supply of goods or the contracting of works or services required; or (b) by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Borrower's country prohibits any import of goods or contracting of works or services from that country, or any payments to any country, person, or entity in that country. When the Works EPC/Turnkey is implemented across jurisdictional boundaries (and more than one country is a Borrower, and is involved in the procurement), then exclusion of a firm or individual on the basis of ITA 5.1(a) above by any country may be applied to that procurement across other countries involved, if the Bank and the Borrowers involved in the procurement agree.

B. Contents of the Initial Selection Document

6. Sections of Initial Selection Document

6.1 This Initial Selection Document consists of parts 1 and 2 which comprise all the sections indicated below, and which should be

read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITA 8.

PART 2 Employer's Requirements

- Section VII - Scope of Employer's Requirements

6.2 Unless obtained directly from the Employer, the Employer accepts no responsibility for the completeness of the document, responses to requests for clarification, the minutes of the pre-Application meeting (if any), or Addenda to the Initial Selection Document in accordance with ITA 8. In case of any discrepancies, documents issued directly by the Employer shall prevail.

6.3 The Applicant is expected to examine all instructions, forms, and terms in the Initial Selection Document and to furnish with its Application all information or documentation as is required by the Initial Selection Document.

7. Clarification of Initial Selection Document and Pre-Application Meeting

7.1 An Applicant requiring any clarification of the Initial Selection Document shall contact the Employer in writing at the Employer's address indicated **in the ISDS**. The Employer will respond in writing to any request for clarification provided that such request is received no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the deadline for submission of the applications. The Employer shall forward a copy of its response to all prospective Applicants who have obtained the Initial Selection Document directly from the Employer, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. If so indicated **in the ISDS**, the Employer shall also promptly publish its response at the web page identified **in the ISDS**. Should the Employer deem it necessary to amend the Initial Selection Document as a

result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITA 8 and in accordance with the provisions of ITA 17.2.

7.2 If indicated **in the ISDS**, the Applicant's designated representative is invited at the Applicant's cost to attend a pre-Application meeting at the place, date and time mentioned **in the ISDS**. During this pre-Application meeting, prospective Applicants may request clarification of the project requirement, the criteria for qualifications or any other aspects of the Initial Selection Document.

7.3 Minutes of the pre-Application meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Applicants, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Applicants who have obtained the Initial Selection Document. Any modification to the Initial Selection Document that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Application meeting shall be made by the Employer exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITA 8. Non-attendance at the pre-Application meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of an Applicant.

8. Amendment of Initial Selection Document

8.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Applications, the Employer may amend the Initial Selection Document by issuing an Addendum.

8.2 Any Addendum issued shall be part of the Initial Selection Document and shall be communicated in writing to all Applicants who have obtained the Initial Selection Document from the Employer. The Employer shall promptly publish the Addendum at the Employer's web page identified **in the ISDS**.

8.3 To give Applicants reasonable time to take an Addendum into account in preparing their Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications in accordance with ITA 17.2.

C. Preparation of Applications

9. Cost of Applications

9.1 The Applicant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Application. The Employer will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the Initial Selection process.

10. Language of Application

10.1 The Application as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Initial Selection exchanged by the Applicant and

the Employer, shall be written in the language specified **in the ISDS**. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Application may be in another language, provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in the language specified **in the ISDS**, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Application, the translation shall govern.

**11. Documents
Comprising the
Application**

11.1 The Application shall comprise the following:

- (a) **Application Submission Letter**, in accordance with ITA 12.1;
- (b) **Eligibility:** documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's eligibility, in accordance with ITA 13.1;
- (c) **Qualifications:** documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's qualifications, in accordance with ITA 14; and
- (d) any other document required as specified **in the ISDS**.

11.2 The Applicant shall furnish information on commissions and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid to agents or any other party relating to this Application

**12. Application
Submission Letter**

12.1 The Applicant shall complete an Application Submission Letter as provided in Section IV, Application Forms. This Letter must be completed without any alteration to its format.

**13. Documents
Establishing the
Eligibility of the
Applicant**

13.1 To establish its eligibility in accordance with ITA 4, the Applicant shall complete the eligibility declarations in the Application Submission Letter and Forms ELI (eligibility) 1.1 and 1.2, included in Section IV, Application Forms.

**14. Documents
Establishing the
Qualifications of the
Applicant**

To establish its qualifications to perform the contract(s) in accordance with Section III - Initial Selection Criteria and Requirements, the Applicant shall provide the information requested in the corresponding Information Sheets included in Section IV, Application Forms.

Wherever an Application Form requires an Applicant to state a monetary amount, Applicants should indicate the USD equivalent using the rate of exchange determined as follows:

- (a) for construction turnover or financial data required for each year - exchange rate prevailing on the last day of the respective calendar year (in which the amounts for that year are to be converted); and

- (b) value of single contract - exchange rate prevailing on the date of the contract.

Exchange rates shall be taken from the publicly available source identified **in the ISDS**. Any error in determining the exchange rates in the Application may be corrected by the Employer.

15. Signing of the Application and Number of Copies

15.1 The Applicant shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the Application as described in ITA 11 and clearly mark it “ORIGINAL”. The original of the Application shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Applicant. In case the Applicant is a JV, the Application shall be signed by an authorized representative of the JV on behalf of the JV and so as to be legally binding on all the members as evidenced by a power of attorney signed by their legally authorized signatories.

15.2 The Applicant shall submit copies of the signed original Application, in the number specified **in the ISDS**, and clearly mark them “COPY”. In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.

D. Submission of Applications

16. Sealing and Marking of Applications

16.1 The Applicant shall enclose the original and the copies of the Application in a sealed envelope that shall:

- (a) bear the name and address of the Applicant;
- (b) be addressed to the Employer, in accordance with ITA 17.1; and
- (c) bear the specific identification of this Initial Selection process indicated in the ISDS 1.1.

16.2 The Employer will accept no responsibility for not processing any envelope that was not identified as required in ITA 16.1 above.

17. Deadline for Submission of Applications

17.1 Applicants may either submit their Applications by mail or by hand. Applications shall be received by the Employer at the address and no later than the deadline indicated **in the ISDS**. When so specified **in the ISDS**, Applicants have the option of submitting their Applications electronically, in accordance with electronic Application submission procedures specified **in the ISDS**.

17.2 The Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications by amending the Initial Selection Document in accordance with ITA 8, in which case all rights and obligations of the Employer and the Applicants subject to the previous deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.

18. Late Applications

18.1 The Employer reserves the right to accept applications received after the deadline for submission of applications, unless otherwise specified **in the ISDS**.

19. Opening of Applications

19.1 The Employer shall open all Applications at the date, time and place specified **in the ISDS**. Late Applications shall be treated in accordance with ITA 18.1.

19.2 Applications submitted electronically (if permitted pursuant to ITA 17.1) shall be opened in accordance with the procedures specified **in the ISDS**.

19.3 The Employer shall prepare a record of the opening of Applications to include, as a minimum, the name of the Applicants. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Applicants.

E. Procedures for Evaluation of Applications

20. Confidentiality

20.1 Information relating to the Applications, their evaluation and results of the Initial Selection shall not be disclosed to Applicants or any other persons not officially concerned with the Initial Selection process until the notification of Initial Selection results is made to all Applicants in accordance with ITA 28.

20.2 From the deadline for submission of Applications to the time of notification of the results of the Initial Selection in accordance with ITA 28, any Applicant that wishes to contact the Employer on any matter related to the Initial Selection process may do so only in writing.

21. Clarification of Applications

21.1 To assist in the evaluation of Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, ask an Applicant for a clarification (including missing documents) of its Application, to be submitted within a stated reasonable period of time. Any request for clarification from the Employer and all clarifications from the Applicant shall be in writing.

21.2 If an Applicant does not provide clarifications and/or documents requested by the date and time set in the Employer's request for clarification, its Application shall be evaluated based

on the information and documents available at the time of evaluation of the Application.

22. Responsiveness of Applications

22.1 The Employer may reject any Application which is not responsive to the requirements of the Initial Selection Document. In case the information furnished by the Applicant is incomplete or otherwise requires clarification as per ITA 21.1, and the Applicant fails to provide satisfactory clarification and/or missing information, it may result in disqualification of the Applicant.

23. Margin of Preference

23.1 Unless otherwise specified **in the ISDS**, a margin of preference for domestic Proposers¹ shall not apply in the RFP process resulting from this Initial Selection.

24. Subcontractors

24.1 Unless otherwise stated **in the ISDS**, the Employer does not intend to execute any specific elements of the Works EPC/Turnkey by sub-contractors selected in advance by the Employer (so-called “Nominated Subcontractors”).

24.2 The Applicant shall not propose to subcontract the whole of the contract. The Applicant may propose subcontractors for certain specialized parts of the works, except the parts of the works for which subcontracting is not permitted as stated **in the ISDS**. Applicants planning to use such specialized subcontractors shall specify, in the Application Submission Letter, the parts of the Works proposed to be subcontracted along with details of the proposed subcontractors including their qualification and experience.

24.3 The Applicant shall not propose to subcontract works with a total accumulated value greater than the percentage stated **in the ISDS**.

F. Evaluation of Applications and Initial Selection of Applicants

25. Evaluation of Applications

25.1 The Employer shall use the factors, methods, criteria, and requirements defined in Section III, Initial Selection Criteria and Requirements and the ISDS to evaluate the qualifications of the Applicants, and no other factors, methods, criteria, or requirements shall be used. The Employer reserves the right to waive minor deviations from the qualification criteria if they do

¹ An individual firm is considered a domestic Proposer for purposes of the margin of preference if it is registered in the country of the Employer, has more than 50 percent ownership by nationals of the country of the Employer, and if it does not subcontract more than 10 percent of the contract price, excluding provisional sums, to foreign contractors. JVs are considered as domestic Proposers and eligible for domestic preference only if the individual member firms are registered in the country of the Employer, have more than 50 percent ownership by nationals of the country of the Employer, and the JV shall be registered in the country of the Borrower. The JV shall not subcontract more than 10 percent of the contract price, excluding provisional sums, to foreign firms. JVs between foreign and national firms will not be eligible for domestic preference.

not materially affect the technical capability and financial resources of an Applicant to perform the Contract.

25.2 Subcontractors proposed by the Applicant shall be fully qualified for their parts of the works. The subcontractor's qualifications shall not be used by the Applicant to qualify for the Works EPC/Turnkey unless the applicant designates them as Specialized Subcontractors, in which case, the qualifications of the Specialized Subcontractor proposed by the Applicant may be added to the qualifications of the Applicant for the purpose of the evaluation, if specified **in the ISDS**.

25.3 In case of multiple contracts, Applicants should indicate in their Applications the individual contract or combination of contracts in which they are interested. The Employer shall initially select each Applicant for the maximum combination of contracts for which the Applicant has thereby indicated its interest and for which the Applicant meets the appropriate aggregate requirements specified in Section III - Initial Selection Criteria and Requirements.

25.4 However, with respect to the specific experience under item Section III (Qualification Criteria and Requirements), 4.2, the Employer will select any one or more of the options as identified below:

N is the minimum number of contracts

V is the minimum value of a single contract.

(a) Initial Selection for one Contract:

Option 1: (i) N contracts, each of minimum value V;

Or

Option 2: (i) N contracts, each of minimum value V,

Or

(ii) Less than or equal to N contracts, each of minimum value V, but with total value of all contracts equal or more than $N \times V$

(b) Initial Selection for Multiple Contracts

Option 1: (i) Minimum requirements for combined contract(s) shall be the aggregate requirements for each contract for which the Applicant has applied for as follows, and N1, N2, N3, etc. shall be different contracts:

Lot 1: N1 contracts, each of minimum value V1;

Lot 2: N2 contracts, each of minimum value V2;

Lot 3: N3 contracts, each of minimum value V3;----etc.

Option 2: (i) Minimum requirements for combined contract(s) shall be the aggregate requirements for each contract for which the Applicant has applied for as follows, and N1, N2, N3, etc. shall be different contracts:

Lot 3: N3 contracts, each of minimum value V3;----etc.,

Or

Option 3: (i) Minimum requirements for combined contract(s) shall be the aggregate requirements for each contract for which the Applicant has applied for as follows, and N1, N2, N3, etc. shall be different

contracts:

Lot 1: N1 contracts, each of minimum value V1;

Lot 2: N2 contracts, each of minimum value V2;

Lot 3: N3 contracts, each of minimum value V3;---etc.,

Or

(ii) **Lot 1:** N1 contracts, each of minimum value V1; or number of contracts less than or equal to N1, each of minimum value V1, but with total value of all contracts equal or more than $N1 \times V1$

Lot 2: N2 contracts, each of minimum value V2; or number of contracts less than or equal to N2, each of minimum value V2, but with total value of all contracts equal or more than $N2 \times V2$

Lot 3: N3 contracts, each of minimum value V3; or number of contracts less than or equal to N3, each of minimum value V3, but with total value of all contracts equal or more than $N3 \times V3$ etc.,

Or

25.5 Only the qualifications of the Applicant shall be considered. The qualifications of other firms, including the Applicant's subsidiaries, parent entities, affiliates, subcontractors (other than specialized subcontractors in accordance with ITA 25.2 above) or any other firm(s) different from the Applicant shall not be considered.

26. Employer's Right to Accept or Reject Applications

26.1 The Employer reserves the right to accept or reject any Application, and to annul the Initial Selection process and reject all Applications at any time, without thereby incurring any liability to the Applicants.

27. Initial Selection of Applicants

27.1 The range of Applicants that the Employer may Initially Select (x = minimum number, y = maximum number) is specified in the ISDS.

27.2 Initial Selection of Applicants involves several steps, as follows:

(a) **Step 1 - Table 1 Evaluation:** The first step of Initial Selection involves evaluation against the methods, criteria and requirements described in Section III, Table 1: Qualification Criteria and Requirements;

(b) **Step 2 - Rejection:** Applicants that do not substantially meet the qualification criteria and requirements in Table 1: Qualification Criteria and Requirements will not be evaluated further, and will be eliminated from the Initial Selection process;

29. Request for Proposals

29.1 Promptly after the notification of the results of the Initial Selection, the Employer shall invite Proposals from all the Applicants that have been initially selected.

29.2 Proposers may be required to provide a Proposal Security or a Proposal-Securing Declaration acceptable to the Employer in the form and an amount to be specified in the RFP document.

29.3 The successful Proposer shall be required to provide a Performance Security as specified in the RFP document.

29.4 If applicable, the successful Proposer may also be required to provide a separate Environmental and Social (ES) Performance Security.

29.5 Proposers shall be required to provide a Code of Conduct which will apply to their and subcontractors' personnel that includes the minimum requirements specified in the RFP document.

29.6 The successful Proposer shall provide additional information about its beneficial ownership using the Beneficial Ownership Disclosure Form included in the RFP document.

Section VI - Fraud and Corruption

1. Purpose

- (b) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 2.2 e. below.

- b. Rejects a proposal for award if the Bank determines that the firm or individual recommended for award, any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/ or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- c. In addition to the legal remedies set out in the relevant Legal Agreement, may take other appropriate actions, including declaring misprocurement, if the Bank determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement process, selection and/or execution of the contract in question, without the Borrower having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;
- d. Pursuant to the Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines, and in accordance with the Bank's prevailing sanctions policies and procedures, may sanction a firm or individual, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, including by publicly declaring such a firm or individual ineligible (i) to be awarded or otherwise benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or in any other manner;¹ (ii) to be a nominated² sub-contractor, consultant, manufacturer or supplier, or service provider of an otherwise eligible firm being awarded a Bank-financed contract; and (iii) to receive the proceeds of any loan made by the Bank or otherwise to participate further in the preparation or implementation of any Bank-financed project;
- e. Requires that a clause be included in request for bid/request for proposals documents and in contracts financed by a Bank loan, requiring (i) bidders (applicants/proposers), consultants, contractors, and suppliers, and their sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers, suppliers, agents, personnel, permit the Bank to inspect³ all accounts, records and other documents relating to the procurement process, selection and/or contract execution, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

Section VII - Scope of Employer’s Requirements

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1. Description of the Works (EPC/Turnkey)

The Eskom Holdings SOC Limited, the Recipient has been allocated grant funds (the “Grant”) from the Energy Sector Management Assistance Program (ESMAP) which are administered by the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) (the “Bank”) and executed by the Eskom Holdings SOC Limited (“the Client”). The Client intends to apply the funds to eligible payments under the contract which may arise from this Initial Selection process and subsequent Request for Proposal processes that may follow. Payments by the Bank will be made only at the request of the Client and upon approval by the Bank, and will be subject, in all respects, to the terms and conditions of the grant agreement.

1. Outline description of the Works

The EPC Contractor will be responsible for surveying, design, engineering, manufacture, procurement and supply of all materials and labour, delivery to site, offloading, construction, erection, installation, off-site testing, on-site testing, commissioning, performance testing, provision of samples, preparation of all detail design drawings, as-built record drawings, maintenance manuals and instructions for a Solar PV Single Axis Tracker system with a maximum export capacity of 72MWac, including a minimum 18 months Plant Operation and Maintenance Services and the associated Network Integration Equipment (NIE) at Eskom Komati Power Station

The project will be executed over four continuous land parcels all within close proximity as indicated below. The yellow and blue PV trackers indicated the potential development areas with responsibility for final layout still remaining with the contractor.

The EPC contractor shall provide full turn-key engineering, procurement and construction services for a new build solar PV facility situated near the town of Komati in the Mpumalanga province of South Africa. The approximate development area and location is provided below:

The approximate development area is 156 ha (including two excluded zones within the boundary) is shown in Figure 3 above.

The facility shall have a Maximum Export Capacity (MEC) of 72MWac at the point of connection. The bidder can during the detailed design phase maximize the DC and installed nameplate AC capacity to allow for this MEC without exceeding the development areas provided. The facility shall have a life span of 25 years.

In addition, the Contractor should provide an offer for 18 months of Operation of the facility with the option to extend.

The facility shall be constructed to all local, IEC standards in accordance with international as well as South African industry best practice. Where applicable, Eskom Standards may also apply for some sub-sections of the facility.

The facility shall be built using Tier 1 OEMs only for all key equipment including (but not limited to) PV modules, inverters, trackers, transformers, weather stations, SCADA.

The contractor will be expected to conduct all necessary supporting studies including (but not limited to) electrical, civil, grid code, geotechnical, topographical, hydrology) as part of the their scope. Preliminary studies will be provided as part of the full RFP for reference purposes only at a later stage.

2. Overview of the Overall PV System

The PV system will be connected to the existing Eskom grid, at a voltage level of either 11kV, 33kV or 275kV. The EPC Contractor shall be responsible for value engineering and to determine the most optimal voltage for the connection to be made at, aligned with the system limitations and available Points of Connection (POC).

3. Scope of Works Under this Contract

All works shall be carried out strictly to applicable IEC and International standards and specifications. Where no such standard and/or specification are in existence, then compliance to Eskom and/or other industry accepted standards and specifications must be complied with.

The high-level scope of work on this contract can be summarized as:

I. Engineering and Design Phase

The *EPC Contractor* shall be responsible for the preliminary and detailed engineering and design, inclusive of working drawings signed and approved for construction. All approval and sign-off related to engineering and construction drawings, documents, and any other aspect related to the project construction, shall be undertaken by a professionally registered engineer, registered in the specified categories by the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA). The *EPC Contractor* shall optimize the design using the latest available technologies and undertake a life-cycle cost analysis of the works.

Some of the deliverable in this phase, which are not exhaustive include:

Civil and Structural

- (a) Undertake a geotechnical investigation of the PV site area and along the proposed cable evacuation route
- (b) Undertake a topographical and an underground survey of the PV site area and along the proposed cable evacuation route to identify existing services and hazards that may impact on the construction
- (c) Undertake all studies and simulations for civil, electrical, structural, mechanical, hydrological
- (d) Undertake the complete civil engineering design inclusive of layer works for the platform area, access road details, surface and sub-soil drainage and pavement designs

- (e) Undertake the complete structural engineering design for the PV systems station, substation(s) and OEM buildings

Electrical and Mechanical

- (a) Sizing of the PV system and undertaking all relevant design calculations to fulfil the project needs of a 72MW MEC
- (b) Selection of PV technology.
- (c) Design of the PV facility, BOP and grid connection works
- (d) Stability studies of the PV system with the Eskom grid and associated infrastructure
- (e) Compliance with the relevant grid codes
- (f) Sizing of all cables, switchgear, busbars and other electrical infrastructure associated with the evacuation of the energy from the PV system
- (g) Detailed engineering and designs for the entire project, inclusive of Single line Diagrams, General Arrangement, earthing and lightning protection, operational and security lighting, cable routes, switchgear layouts, fencing arrangements, access roads and architectural.
- (h) Detailed engineering studies and designs of all cable installations, not limited to cable sizing for load and fault level withstands, derating calculations to account for installation, bending radii, thermal losses.
- (i) Design a robust and secure cyber security system
- (j) Undertake lightning protection study and design lightning protection to safeguard the installation from lightning.
- (k) Security and Operational Lighting over the project area
- (l) Design a CCTV system around the facility for security surveillance

Deliverables

- (a) Submission of Preliminary and Detailed Engineering and Design Pack, which shall include:
 - Detailed Design report, inclusive of earthing simulations and report, lightning protection analysis and designs, lighting studies, insulation coordination
 - Reports of all supporting investigations, simulations and engineering studies
 - Constructability plan
 - Project execution schedule
 - Project Risks and Mitigation
 - Power and Control Plant detailed design drawings approved for construction
 - Scada and Control and Instrumentation detailed design drawings approved for construction

II. Construction Phase

- (a) Procure the required equipment and materials as per the accepted design for the entire system. It shall include for the procurement, Factory Acceptance Testing (FATs), delivery to site, off-loading, storage, erection, Site Acceptance Tests (SATs), cold and hot commissioning.

- (b) Apply and obtain all relevant licenses and approvals for relevant authorities
- (c) Undertake all construction works in full accordance with regulatory requirements
- (d) Submit all QCP's & ITP's for acceptance

4. *Legal and Regulatory Requirements*

- All applicable laws of the Republic of South Africa
- Eskom Standards and Specifications
- Grid Codes Compliance
- Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993 and amendments thereto)
- Construction Regulations 2014 and all amendments thereto
- All World Bank Governance Procedures

5. *Functional and/or Performance Requirements*

In addition to further requirements to be outlined in the full tender package. The Contractor will be expected to provide a performance ratio (PR) guarantee at both COD (short term testing) as well as annually during the term of operation. In addition, an achieved capacity test will be applicable at COD.

6. *Commissioning and Trial Operation Requirements*

The Contractor will be expected to provide a commissioning plan during the execution phase of the project which shall be reviewed for acceptance by Eskom and its representatives.

A full list of commissioning and equipment tests as typically provided under a utility scale project in South Africa will be applicable.

All performance and grid code testing shall apply. This will include (but is not limited to), short term PR test prior to COD, grid code testing (RETEC), Achieved Capacity test, annual PR testing during operation.

The following minimum requirements for Commissioning and Trial operations shall be required.

- Factory Acceptance Testing: All equipment shall undergo FAT tests prior to being shipped to site and shall meet all technical requirements.
- Site Acceptance Testing: Major equipment shall be tested in accordance with OEM requirements on arrival at site, prior to energization.
- Cold Commissioning: All systems and equipment installed shall undergo relevant testing, carried out by suitably qualified individuals and in accordance with internationally accepted testing procedures.
- Commissioning: The entire system shall be commissioned and tested in accordance with the relevant commissioning procedures, before being energised and connected to the power system.
- All test documentation and records shall be included in the As-Built Handover package.
- Pre-commissioning Verification and Testing: Verification and testing will be performed as specified in the project technical documentation and will include energized equipment.

7. Operations and Maintenance

Completion and handover shall take place only after the completion of the 18 months operational and maintenance obligations have been fulfilled. During the period, the *EPC Contractor* shall be responsible for all operational and maintenance requirements, which shall include the training of local staff to operate the facilities. During the Operational and Maintenance period, the *EPC Contractor* shall be responsible for the care, custody, and control of the system and its components, including preservation, maintenance, operation, security, and other measures or activities required including SHE responsibilities. Notwithstanding transfer of care, custody and control to the Client, the *EPC Contractor’s* obligation shall be fulfilled when the Services have been completed.

8. Testing and Quality Assurance Requirement

Demonstration of capability and experience required on the areas below:

- a) Product / Service Scoping on ISO certificate is defined and relevant
- b) Certificate by Approved and Authorized certification authority
- c) Certification Authority has Recognized International Accreditation
- d) Validity (expiry date) of certificate (Scope on BESS and PV)
- e) Compliance to SANAS or IAF
- f) Scope Specific to Storage or PV generation

2. Implementation Period

Period of 18 months or earlier for the design, procurement, supply, installation, testing, commissioning, and energization of the facility into commercial operation, with a further 18 months operations and maintenance services.

3. Site and Other Data

i. Site Information – Location

Komati Power Station is situated about 37km from Middelburg, 43km from Witbank, via Vandyksdrift. The terrace is 1600 meters above sea level.

Figure 1Θ (above) shows the indicative development area for Komati BESS, the KPS boundary, the natural environment has been severely altered.

1. Soil Conditions

Komati Power Station is underlain by sandstone, shale and coal beds of the Vryheid Formation, Karoo Super-group according to regional geology. Previous Geotechnical Investigations found marshy areas to be mainly clayey and potentially expansive soils may underlie it, however, the actual ground conditions at the selected Site may differ greatly.

2. Climate

KPS occurs in an area with typical Highveld conditions. The summers are moderate and wet while the winters are harsh, cold and dry. Average daily maximum temperatures vary from 27°C in January to 17°C in July, but in extreme cases these may rise to 38°C and 26°C, respectively. In comparison, average daily minima of 13°C and 0°C can be expected, with temperatures falling to 1°C and –13°C, respectively, on unusually cold days. Frost conditions are also common over the 120-day period from May to September (Synergistics Environmental Services, 2013). The average total annual rainfall is ~735 mm with the rain falling mostly in the summer months (October to April). Peak rainfall occurs in January. Prevailing winds are from the north-east and north. The dominant wind directions during the daytime are from south, south-east, west-north-west and north-east. During the night, the most frequent directions are from north, north-east and south-east.

3. Air Quality

The Mpumalanga Highveld region has long been noted to have elevated air pollution concentrations and several sources of elevated emissions are in the region. These sources have been associated with the long-range transportation of pollutants and have the potential for impacting on the air quality of the adjacent and more distant regions. Criteria pollutants identified as of major concern in the region include particulates, sulphur dioxide and nitrogen oxides (Synergistics Environmental Services, 2013).

4. Noise

The main source of noise in the area used to emanate from KPS. Noise sources included the operation of heavy machinery and the handling of materials at the power station and ash dam sites. Following closure of the power station, active noise sources in the area include vehicles on the nearby provincial road, the mining operations, and agricultural activities.

5. Land use

The predominant land uses in the area are electricity generation and transmission facilities, coal mining operations, and agricultural activities with pockets of residential areas supporting these activities.

6. Topography and visuals

The surface topography at KPS is gently undulating to flat with the majority of the area sloping toward the north-west ranging in elevation between 1600 and 1650m above sea level. The topography is altered by the power station and ADF. According to the DFFE screening tool, KPS is of medium sensitivity regarding civil aviation and low sensitivity for defence.

7. Surface Water - Hydrology

KPS occurs within the upper Olifants Water Management Area (WMA), Highveld aquatic Ecoregion and B11B quaternary catchment that have been classified as a Class D (largely modified) system. The Koornspruit River, a tributary of the Olifants River, traverses the area and is classified as a Class D (largely modified) river. There are several wetlands near the power station. The water resource within the upper Olifants Water Management Area is Class III (Heavily Used Water Resource) and the overall condition of the water resource is considered to be significantly altered from its predevelopment condition.

8. Surface Water - Current water management

The power station has both over ground and underground water management systems. The underground water management system conveys both process and storm water to Lake Stoffel. The over ground water management system diverts clean storm water around the power station terrace and routes dirty storm water to Lake Finn and to Lake Stoffel. Excess water in Lake Stoffel is pumped to 3rd Recovery Dam. Excess water in Lake Finn is pumped to the ashing system. Storm water contained in the 3rd Recovery Dam is transferred back into the process via a demineralization plant.

9. Ground Water

Two distinct aquifers, namely a shallow, weathered aquifer and a deeper fractured aquifer occur within the region of the Komati area. In the Komati area the general weathered aquifer extends to approximately 15 m below surface and there is a strong relationship between surface topography and groundwater level, with recharge estimated to be in the order of 3% of the annual rainfall. The deeper fractured aquifer, formed by bedding planes, fractures and faults is developed from approximately 10 m. This aquifer seldom constitutes an economic aquifer as there is seldom significant groundwater flow due to the low porosity of the Ecca group rocks (Synergistics Environmental Services, 2013).

10. Biodiversity and Wetlands

The KPS falls within the Highveld Grasslands region and in the Eastern Highveld Grassland vegetation type. These short, dense grasslands are found on the gently undulating plains of the Highveld and include some low hills and pan depressions. The vegetation is dominated by the usual Highveld grass composition including *Aristida*, *Digitaria*, *Eragrostis*, *Themeda* and *Tristachya* spp. Occasional rocky outcrops occur with wiry, sour grasses and some woody species.

11. Heritage

There is unlikely to be any heritage features within the boundaries of the KPS other than the buildings themselves which may be older than 60 years.
